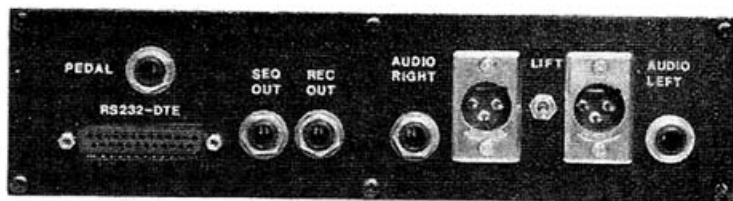
Digital Keyboards has announced the delivery of new software for the Synergy, and the availability of an optional RS232 interface. The software upgrade is now available to current Synergy owners as promised in the announcements at clinics and trade shows.

The Synergy, which is a 32 oscillator digital synthesizer, is capable of new features through software upgrades and additions.

The new software chips contain many performance improvements, a new keyboard response program, larger sequencer, built in diagnostics, nine kinds of recordable transpositions, a digital half speed recording feature, and computer interface software among the new offerings.

The RS232 interface option, consisting of two small PC boards and an expanded output section, allows for connection of the Synergy to a computer with an RS232 connector, and disk drive. Musical functions include the storage and quick retrieval of sequences, programs and voice alterations or patches. This port will also be used to introduce a series of software programs, leading to intermediate notation, complete voicing capability, and future hardware additions. This port also allows for the connection of one Synergy to another in a master/slave relationship. Additionally, the output section includes two programmable jacks for the control of digital drum machines, lights, or effects devices, allowing them to be turned on and off during the recording process, and storing that information.

Digital keyboards has announced an increase in production of the voice cartridges # 1-6 and the Wendy Carlos Set. New voices are to be released early in 1984.
